Application of the UN Global Compact Management Model

The UN Global Compact Management Model is designed to support Global Compact signatories' efforts to assess and improve their alignment with the Global Compact 10 principles.

- Reduce risks. Misalignment with the 10 principles, by identifying areas of greatest risk, then using this information during efforts to develop goals, strategies, and supporting policies
- Pursue opportunities. Reliance on the Management Model can spark innovative ideas aimed at creating value for shareholders and stakeholders over the long term
- Manage impacts. Signatories can better understand the impacts from and benefits of their actions when viewed through the lens of the 10 principles



Linkage between UN Global Compact Management Model and ISO 26000


ISO 26000 and the UN Global Compact are connected by a fundamental belief that organizations should behave in a socially responsible way.

Specific actions taken to ensure the Management Model works in support of ISO 26000 include:

- Identification and consideration of linkages between the Global Compact's 10 principles and ISO 26000. ISO 26000 clauses were linked to specific UN Global Compact Issue Areas (Human Rights, Labour, Environment, and Anti-Corruption)
- Identification and consideration of linkages between the Management Model and ISO 26000. ISO 26000 clauses (7.2 through 7.7 in particular) were both considered during the development of the Management Model and linked to specific steps of the finalized Management Model
